





#### George Orwell: Animal farm

#### Harper Lee: To kill a Mockingbird







### Anna Sewell: Black Beauty

#### Ray Bradbury: Fahrenheit 451







## Madeline Miller: The song of Achilles

## Phovilelle Clayton et alli: Blackout






#### Colleen Hoover: It ends with us
